A mixed group of Flight & Barr Worcester tablewares, early 19th century, including a gadrooned rim plate painted with strawberries, diameter 26cm, two gilt gadrooned rim plates, the first painted and gilt with bellflowers to the rim, the second with scattered blue, pink and gilt floral stems, diameter of both 25cm, a green rimmed plate painted in sepia with hops, diameter 27cm, a pair of plates painted in iron red and gilt with floral and berried sprigs, diameter 22.5cm, two oval dishes, length 29cm, and a diamond shaped dish painted and gilt with vine leaves, length 29.5cm, various impressed and printed marks (some faults and restoration). Provenance: The Flight Collection.

Condition Report

Strawberry plate - couple of tiny chips to rim, later painted, light surface scratches and wear.

Bellflower plate - extensive chipping to circumference of rim underside, gilt rim worn, light surface scratches, footrim chipped.

Gadroon rimmed plate with pink and blue flowers - light surface scratches, very minor wear.

Plate with hops - restoration to rim, scratched overall.

Pair plates with berried sprigs - in good order with light surface scratches.

Two oval dishes - generally ok but quite heavily scratched/worn.

Diamond dish with vine leaves - significant glued repair.

Blue ground diamond dish - good condition.

Circular dish with pink rose to centre - generally ok, light wear.

Pair turquoise ground gilt rimmed plates - wear/scratches to turquoise ground, otherwise ok.

Plate with border of pink roses - restoration to rim, some wear.

Plate with cornflowers - generally ok, gilt rim completely worn on half of circumference, typical light surface scratches.
