A Second World War period Japanese katana with curved single-edged blade, blade length 68cm, the tang finely signed to both sides with quality control stamp and single peg hole piercing, part-pierced cast bronze tsuba, fabric tape bound fishskin grip with partially hidden bronze menuki fittings, fuchi and kabuto-gane pommel, with stitched leather covered wood scabbard with lacquered finish.

Estimate: £500 - £700

Condition Report

3537. Blade with old evidence of possibly being re-polished. Some very small spots of active rust, tang with evidence of old rust but now inactive. Some breakdown in tape fabric binding on grip. Some small areas of loss to fish skin, particularly around peg hole. Scabbard with general fatigue and breakdown in leather work. Some fatigue to wooden boards beneath. Some losses.
