A late 19th century Sudanese kaskar sword with straight single-edged double-fullered blade, blade length 91cm, with short lines of text to narrow fullers, steel 'T'-shaped crossguard and embossed white metal applied grip, together with a French 1866 model Chassepot bayonet and an ice pick, possibly military issue, with web strap and sliding ring mount.
