### LOT 1166

An early Victorian mahogany bracket clock with eight day twin fusee movement striking on a bell, the 7½-inch circular silvered dial with black Roman hour numerals and inscribed 'Loudan. 16 Blackfriars Road London', the Gothic arched case with applied foliate mouldings and pierced fret panels to sides, on a moulded rectangular base and bun feet, height 49cm, with pendulum. Note: William Loudan is a recorded London clockmaker working between 1825 and 1851.

Estimate: £200 - £400

### Condition Report

1166. Generally good condition with some cosmetic issues. Some small chips to mouldings to right hand top corner and tip of arch. Replacement pierced fret panels to sides. Back door with veneer loss and chips. Silvered dial with typical wear. Movement winds smoothly and the clock runs, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

The strike mechanism winds, but needs attention as it continually strikes once it starts.

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
