A pair of George III silver Corinthian column candlesticks, each with a square beaded detachable nozzle above a foliate and ram's mask scone, on a similarly decorated square beaded base, London 1772 by SL, height 32.5cm.

Condition Report

320. Generally both in a little tired condition with wear and lead repairs.

Candlestick 1 - overall surface scratches and wear, particularly to highpoints. Small lead repairs to three corners of base, numerous small dents and dints to base and column. Small lead repair to band just below capital, small dents to corners of capitals and a small repair to inner rim of capital. Nozzle ok with typical wear and part marks. Marks to candlestick base edge readable, but rubbed.

Candlestick 2 - overall surface scratches and wear, particularly to highpoints. Small lead repairs to three corners of base. Numerous small dents and dints to base and column. Small lead repair to inner rim of capital and to two corners of the capital. Nozzle with typical wear, one corner slightly misshapen. Part marks visible, marks to candlestick base edge slightly rubbed but good.
