### LOT 1586

An E.J.D. Bodley Staffordshire pottery aesthetic design part service, circa 1887, printed in brown with birds and insects hovering around pendant flowers hung from foliate bands against a pale lemon yellow ground, the handles moulded as bamboo, comprising eight teacups and saucers, eight tea plates, sugar bowl and milk jug, printed and painted marks to bases.

Estimate: £50 - £80

### Condition Report

Cups - 3 crazed and of these one is heavily stained. 5 cups not crazed but one of these has a small haircrack to the top of the handle. Otherwise all ok.

Jug - crazed but ok with very light staining.

Bowl - crazed with haircrack across base.

Saucers - no crazing, one with minuscule nick to underside rim edge, typical wear to wells.

Plates - no crazing, each ok but with knife cuts/scratches commensurate with age and use.

Overall gilding and other decoration good with no real signs of wear.
