An Almeric Walter pâte-de-verre glass paperweight in the form of a butterfly, designed by Henri Bergé, 1920s, raised on a circular base, incised marks 'A Walter Nancy' and 'H Bergé Sc', length approx 13cm (faults).

Condition Report

Large flat chip to top edge of right wing which runs the width of the wing from the central body to the tip, starting narrow at the body and getting wider to the end where at its widest point it is approximately 2cm.

There are some smaller nicks along its length to the underside of the wing.

The left wing has an approximate 2cm long by 0.5cm wide chip along its top edge.

There is an approximate 1cm square flat chip to the front edge of the base beneath the lower half of the right wing.

The base has an approximate 1.5cm long by 1cm wide flat chip to the underside.
