### LOT 1546

An English pearlware cow creamer, late 18th century, Staffordshire or Yorkshire, with Pratt-type sponged detail, modelled with the standing cow, recumbent calf and borage, on an oval mound base, height 17.2cm (faults), together with a Staffordshire pottery treacle glazed cow creamer and milkmaid group, early 19th century, modelled as a standing cow with seated milkmaid and bowl on a shaped base, height 13.2cm.

### Condition Report

Pratt type - typical overall fine crazing to the glaze, lacking cover. Small triangular shaped chip out of front edge of base beneath cow's head, cow missing most of tail and tips of both horns. Calf ok. Missing sizable sections of borage behind cow and small section before calf.

Treacle glazed - typical overall fine crazing to the glaze, lacking cover. Small chip to footrim of base which has other minor nibbles/fritting. Haircrack to front right hoof of cow which has some inconsequential firing cracks to its body, e.g., across top end of tail where joined to body.
