Five pieces of West German pottery, 1960s/70s, comprising a mottled blue and green glazed Scheurich Europ Linie floor jug, original applied paper label and moulded marks to base with numerals 279-38, height 39cm, a Kurt Tschörner designed Ruscha 313 shape jug with swept handle and mottled orange glaze, height 16cm, a Scheurich Lora vase with red glazed flame like motifs against a shaded brown glaze, moulded marks to base with shape No. 206-26, height 26.5cm, a Schlossberg blue glazed single handled jug vase with red lava type glazed band, shape No. 64 25 moulded to base, height 26cm, and a Scheurich running brown glaze tapered cylindrical vase, height 28cm (minor faults).

Estimate: £80 - £120

Condition Report

Ruscha jug - some crazing to the glaze with a few indistinct hairlines to the handle amidst the crazing which are only visible on VERY close inspection with a keen eye. A few minuscule glaze frits to the tip of the spout and a tiny chip like blemish to the footrim which has probably been there since manufacture.

Scheurich mottled blue and green floor jug - typical overall fine crazing to the glaze and in good condition overall with no cracks or restoration. Minuscule flea bite nick to top rim edge of neck and a few spots to edge of foot where glaze hasn't quite reached revealing some white spots of the body beneath - a manufacturing issue. Some minor and light surface scratches to glaze.

Lora vase - small flat chip to footrim, probably there since manufacture, otherwise in good condition.

Schlossberg jug - some light surface scratches to glaze overall, but otherwise in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration.

Brown glazed vase - glaze heavily crazed, small manufacturing adhesion blemish to glaze of handle, otherwise in good condition with no cracks, chips or restoration.
