A Fulham Pottery stoneware flask, circa 1830-40, the buff body of oval shape beneath the brown dipped fluted shoulders, impressed 'BINGLEY 42 & 125 Seymour Street Somers Town', opposing a half pint mark and 'FULHAM STONE POTTERY', height 17cm (minor faults). Note: similar flasks are illustrated by Robin Hildyard 'Browne Mugs, English Brown Stoneware', Victoria and Albert Museum, p.50 and p.51.

Condition Report

Small chip approx 0.8cm long by 0.5cm wide to outer neck rim (not on edge), similar sized chip to edge of brown glazed section on left shoulder, and another similar on the other shoulder around what would appear to be a firing blemish. Other manufacturing glaze blemishes to body overall. 3 chips to footrim each approx 1cm long by 0.5cm wide. Overall fine crazing to the glaze. No restoration or cracks.
