LOT 1582

Four pieces of West German pottery, 1960s/70s, comprising two Gräflisch Ortenburg single handled jugs, covered in erupted red lava type glazes against a black ground, shape Nos. 619 and 605/1(?), moulded shield mark and numerals to bases, tallest 24cm high, an Emons & Söhne Keramik jug with mottled red glaze and high swept handle, indistinct moulded marks to base, height 23cm, and a Ruscha red glazed jug with matt black lava glaze pattern, designed by Otto Gerharz, shape No. 333, height 18cm.

Estimate: £120 - £180

Condition Report

Ruscha jug shape 333 - a number of small nicks/chips to footrim and some random red paint to handle although it doesn't look restored.

Shape 619 jug with glazed over manufacturer's chip to footrim, otherwise ok.

Other Ortenburg jug with small chip to footrim.

Emons & Sohne jug has unsprung chip/haircrack to spout with associated minuscule nick along one of the lines of the haircrack.
