A Seiko 'Pogue' Chronograph Automatic stainless steel gentleman's bracelet wristwatch, Ref. 6139-6000, circa May 1969, with signed and jewelled 6139A caliber movement, the signed yellow dial with luminous hour markers, subsidiary dial, day and date apertures and inner rotating bezel, the case with blue and red tachymeter scale bezel, the signed case back detailed '6139-6000' and '959007', the bracelet with signed foldover clasp, case width 4.1cm. Note: the Pogue nickname was coined after NASA astronaut Colonel William Pogue, who wore a Seiko 6139 with yellow dial into space, making it the first automatic chronograph in space. He was part of the Skylab 4 mission, which lasted 84 days between 16th November 1973 and February 8th 1974.

Condition Report

1054. The watch is generally in good condition commensurate with age. Typical surface scratches and wear to case, bracelet, glass and bezel but no significant damage. Bracelet good and clasp in good working order. Dial in good clean condition. Inner bezel working smoothly.

The watch winds and adjust smoothly, date rolls over as it should but it is not currently running.

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
