A pair of Chinese cloisonné bottle vases with gilt copper mounts, 19th century, each of quatrelobed baluster form, decorated with flowers, scrolling leafy tendrils and butterflies on a gilt keyfret-filled turquoise ground, height 30.5cm (faults and repairs).

### Condition Report

1035. Vase 1 - there is an approx 4cm x 23cm area to the lobe of the body which has been damaged and repaired/refilled and painted, and a small dent next to it. Otherwise this vase is in generally good condition, typical surface scratches and wear to gilt rims and body. Good vibrant colours.

Vase 2 - more significant damage. Large vertical dent between the lobes of the body covering an area of approx 10cm x 4cm with some minor enamel loss to this impact area. Also an approx 5cm x 6cm area to the lobe of the body which has been damaged and repaired/refilled and painted. Otherwise typical surface scratches and wear to gilt rims and body with good vibrant colours.
