A Chinese Hongmu throne-style mirror stand, late Qing dynasty, the carved and pierced graduated five-panel back decorated with figural scenes and flowers, each surmounted with carved dragon head crestings, all supported on a galleried rectangular base fitted with a drawer, the front carved in low relief with lotus and scrolling tendrils, above a similarly carved frieze and scroll feet, height 67.5cm, width 48.3cm, depth 32cm.

Condition Report

1074. The piece is in generally good condition with no significant damage or repairs. Typical light surface scratches and wear. Small glue repair to central surmount finial.

No key and drawer is locked shut.

A little dusty and dirty and would benefit from a clean. Otherwise, nice quality carved panels, in good sturdy order, all panels and galleries are present, with no missing parts.
