A pair of Chinese famille rose enamelled porcelain vases, mid to late 19th century, each shouldered cylindrical body and flared neck painted with opposing panels of birds amidst blossoming branches, reserved against a flower and bird-filled turquoise ground, height 34cm (some minor glaze flaking to turquoise ground).

Estimate: £200 - £400

Condition Report

Both vases in good condition overall with no chips or restoration.

One has a 3cm long haircrack running along the top of its neck rim where some kind of impact must have historically occurred.

Both vases have glaze flaking/loss to the turquoise ground and some of the turquoise details on the panels - because of the nature of the decoration this is not immediately apparent and more noticeable on closer inspection.
