A pair of Chinese famille verte and powder blue ground porcelain vases and covers, mark of Kangxi but late 19th century, each domed cover with Buddhistic lion finial, each baluster body painted with opposing barbed panels of coastal landscapes and birds amidst flowering branches, all reserved against a powder blue ground, underglaze blue four-character mark to bases, heights 32.5cm (one with minor hairline to rim and chip to cover).

Estimate: £250 - £350

Condition Report

1004. Vase 1 - good condition, no chips, cracks or repairs. Cover also in good condition.

Vase 2 - vase with 3.5cm long vertical hairline to the neck, otherwise good condition. Cover has a 0.8cm x 2.2cm chip to the rim, and a small chip to head of lion finial.

Both with typical light surface scratches and wear to enamels and glaze. Decoration is bright and vibrant.
