A pair of Chinese blue and white porcelain baluster vases and covers, marks of Kangxi but late Qing dynasty, painted with blossoming prunus branches, underglaze blue four-character marks to bases, height 28cm (one footrim repaired), together with three similarly decorated ginger jars and a cover (some faults).

Estimate: £60 - £100

Condition Report

1029. Vase 1 - generally good condition, no significant damage or repairs. Two minor shallow chips to rim interior. Otherwise just typical light surface scratches and wear. The cover has a small hairline to inner rim, otherwise in good order.

Vase 2 - approx three quarters of the footrim has been broken and re-glued with some chipping and missing pieces around these breaks. Small chip to rim, otherwise body ok. Cover with re-glued finial.

3 ginger jars - in good condition with no chips, cracks or repairs. The cover with numerous chips to rim.
