A Chinese giltwood rectangular wall mirror, probably late Qing dynasty, carved in relief and pierced with borders of flowers, dragon columns, mythical figures and fruiting vines, framing a canted corner rectangular mirror panel, beneath a reverse painting on glass depicting a warrior and kneeling attendant, flanked by four inset Canton enamel panels, painted with polychrome flowers and butterflies on a yellow ground, height 87cm, width 96cm (minor faults).

Condition Report

1160. Generally good condition, typical scuffs, scratches and wear.
Missing/chipped corner of gilt frame to lower left. Few other splits and chips to gilt frame, some re-touched with gilt, otherwise carved and pierced work in generally good order.
Mirror glass is good and reverse painted panel in good order.
Enamel panels appear to have hairline cracks, scratches and wear.
More pronounced scratches/gouges to lower right panel.
