LOT 1150

A George III style mahogany bracket clock by Sinclair, Harding & Bazeley, late 20th century, the eight day triple fusee movement chiming on a nest of eight bells and striking on a larger bell, the foliate engraved backplate signed 'Sinclair Harding and Bazeley', the 7-½ inch brass breakarch dial with silvered strike/silent indicator to the arch above a silvered chapter ring and similarly signed silvered plaque, cornered with gilt mask and scroll spandrels, the case with moulded arch pediment and brass handle above glazed doors and sides, on a moulded plinth base and gilt brass bracket feet, height 44cm, with pendulum and winding key.

Estimate: £700 - £1,000

Condition Report

1150. The clock is in generally good clean condition.

Case is good with only typical light scuffs and wear. Brasswork is good

Dial in good clean condition.

All 3 trains wind smoothly, the movement runs and striking mechanism appears to be in working order.

However, the suspension spring on the pendulum is bent and is making the pendulum swing irregularly and leading to it stopping, and the minute hand on the dial is loose and needs attaching properly.

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
