An early 19th century Irish mahogany longcase clock with eight day movement striking on a bell, the 12-inch circular painted dial with black Roman hour numerals and subsidiary seconds and inscribed 'Thos Fairclough, DUBLIN', the hood with arched surmount and brass ball finial, the trunk with cut corners and arch top door, on a plain base and bracket feet, height 208cm, with pendulum and two weights. Note: Thomas Fairclough is a recorded Irish clockmaker working in Dublin, circa 1824.

Condition Report

1177. The clock is in generally good condition. It has obviously been restored at some point with a replacement moulded cornice to hood. Repaired vertical split to side of case.

Dial with a few marks, minor retouching and minor scratches otherwise good.

Both trains of movement wind smoothly, strike mechanism in working order, and it is currently running, but please be aware we give no guarantees to working order or reliability of any clock or watch.

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
