A Chinese hardwood and silk embroidered table screen and stand, late Qing dynasty, the embroidered panel finely worked in coloured threads with a cockerel surrounded by other birds, trees and flowers, two lines of stitched black text and two red seal marks to upper left corner, the rectangular frame inlaid with mother-of-pearl lotus flowers and brass scrolling tendrils, the slotted stand with similarly inlaid decoration, on carved recumbent Buddhistic lion feet, height 78.5cm, width 61cm.

Estimate: £300 - £500

Condition Report

1075. Generally good condition. Frame and stand in good order with no significant damage or repairs. Inlay is good and all appears to be present with only a few pieces of brasswork lifting slightly. Mother-of-pearl all good. One small section to back of frame missing, as can be seen in images.

The silkwork is generally good with good vibrant colours and no unstitching. Unfortunately there are some areas of staining/discolouration to the cream ground which is obviously noticeable in the images.

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
